Is not this what Jesus said in the latter days ... <u>"And then many will be offended</u>, will betray one another, and will hate one another?" (Matthew 24:10 NKJV)

The soul of man is cluttered with the things of this world that will provide no insight into reality and reason. The soul is not in order ... the bent of their soul is fleshly, not spiritual. Clarity is missing because purity is lacking! The tune is off and the tone is missing!

I was fascinated by the message the prophet Jeremiah spoke at the garbage dump in the valley of Ben-Hinnom recorded in chapter 19. He persuaded the leaders of the people and priests to follow him through the 'Gate of Broken Pots' ... and He told them about their idols, disloyalty to the Almighty, and their selfish actions. What was to happen to them because of their disobedience would be called *'monument to their stupidity.'* (Jeremiah 18:16, 19:8) Chapters 18 and 19 must be read by you soon.
