# Two Empty Boats

Have you ever noticed the '**two empty boats**' in the narrative described by Luke in chapter 5? I have read this passage over and over in my fifty-plus years as a Christian, preached from it countless of times, and yet I discovered something new, enriching, and so profound!

You know the story well. Great crowds are pressing in on Jesus as they listen to Him. Then these verses appear:

"He noticed two empty boats at the water's edge, for the fishermen had left them and were washing their nets. Stepping into one of the boats, Jesus asked Simon, its owner, to push it out into the water. So he sat in the boat and taught the crowds from there." Luke 5:2-3 NLT

The narrative continues regarding **taking the boat out** into the deep as directed by Jesus and letting down the nets to catch fish. Peter had been fishing all night and 'caught nothing' (Luke 5:5 NLT)! Yet he agrees and follows the directive of Jesus and lets the nets down as instructed. The Bible records the following:

"And this time their nets were so full of fish they began to tear. A shout for help brought their partners in **the other boat**, and soon both boats were filled with fish, and on the verge of sinking." Luke 5:6-7 NLT

There is so much here. Where do I start? Empty Boats ... no longer empty, but filled!! Here is what caught my attention: Two Empty Boats and Jesus chose one of them. Why did he choose one over another? How was that selection made? I pondered this because so many people with whom I meet and deal with 'feel like empty boats!' They are 'empty'... empty of joy, hope, and courage, empty of confidence and passion ... *they are empty!* They have been 'out all night' and yet feel so unfilled and useless ... like a weary, useless, empty boat!

I pondered this, thought about it, and then a 'lightning bolt' from the Holy Spirit got my attention! The boat only remains empty until the owner gives permission and accessibility to enter or board! *Jesus gets into the boat with the permission of the owner*! Maybe Peter owned both boats, but he was present at one of them. He is the one who allowed Jesus into the vessel and pushed it out into the water! When the one boat began to be filled with fish, 'a shout for help brought their partners in the other boat' to help and they were filled with fish.

<u>Here is the lesson</u>: If you feel like you are empty, have 'toiled all night,' have nothing and have accomplished nothing, but *feel useless, unwanted and unproductive,* simply give Jesus **permission** to get in your boat, teach you, and follow His directions! **Grant accessibility**, **total accessibility**, to the 'whole boat,' to the whole life! Emptiness is soon FILLED with what you were seeking, and that for which you were fishing and were longing for in the first place! You discover a 'big catch!'

And here is the special event ... you will fill up other 'empty boats' and the lives around you, with the 'catch' Jesus is giving you! They cease to be empty and they become filled with peace, purpose,

and productivity! They are blessed by Jesus from your agreement with Him. Wow! Do you see it? Do you feel it?

Look what the Bible says: "For he was awestruck by the number of fish they had caught, as were the others with him" Luke 5:9. Jesus says the following to Peter.

# "... 'Don't be afraid! From now on you'll be fishing for people!' And as soon as they landed, they left everything and followed Jesus" Luke 5:9-11 NLT.

When Jesus is invited into your 'boat' totally and unrestricted, things happen and change!

Time to go fishing...with Jesus!
