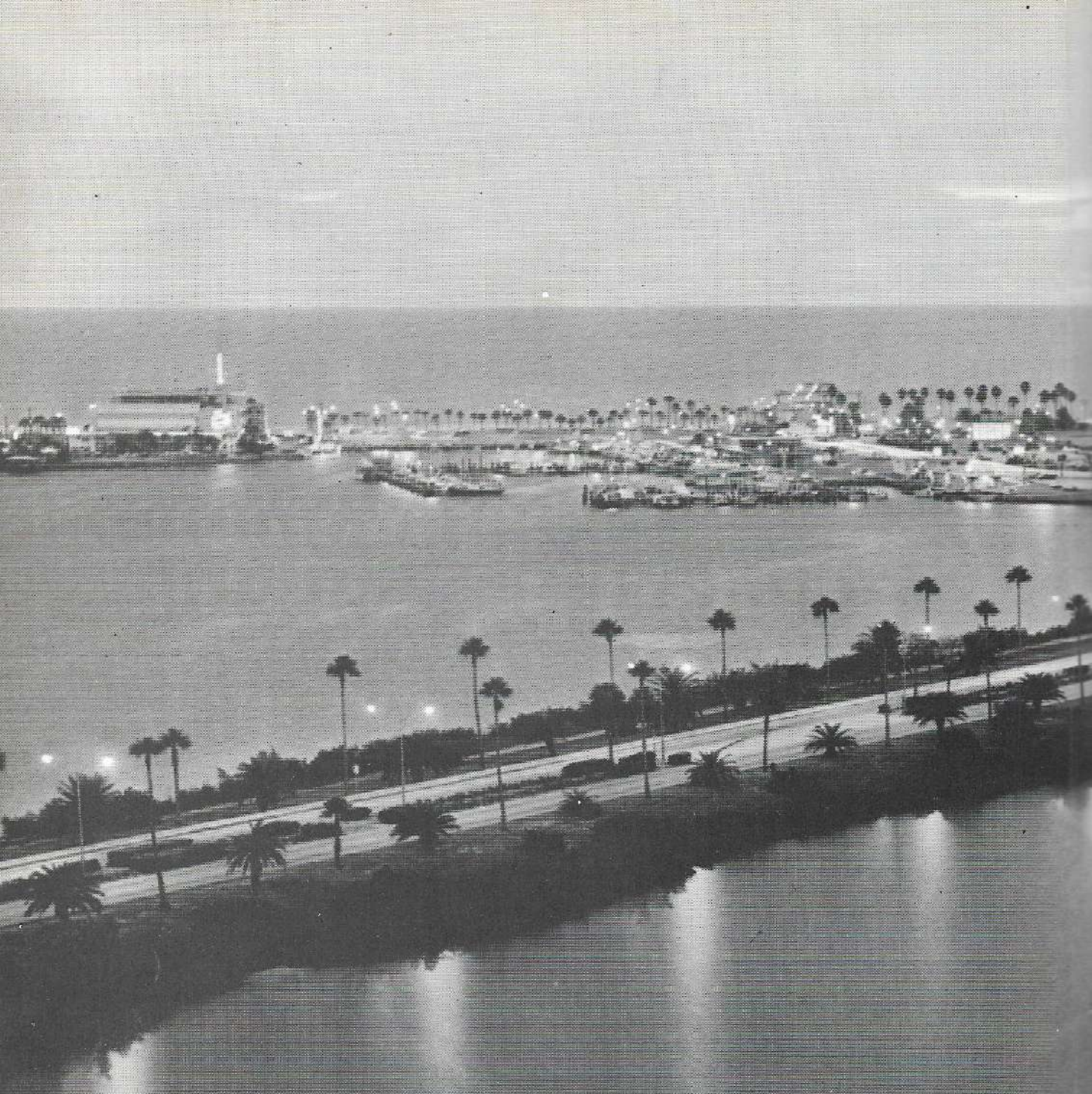

We the class of 1966 do wish to dedicate this yearbook to a man whom God has used much in our lives these past few years.

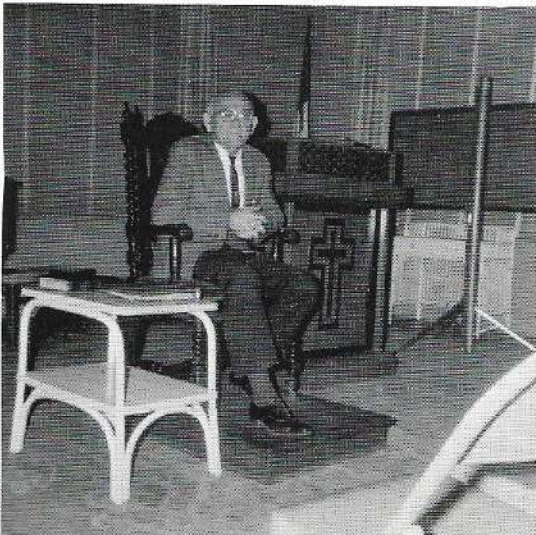
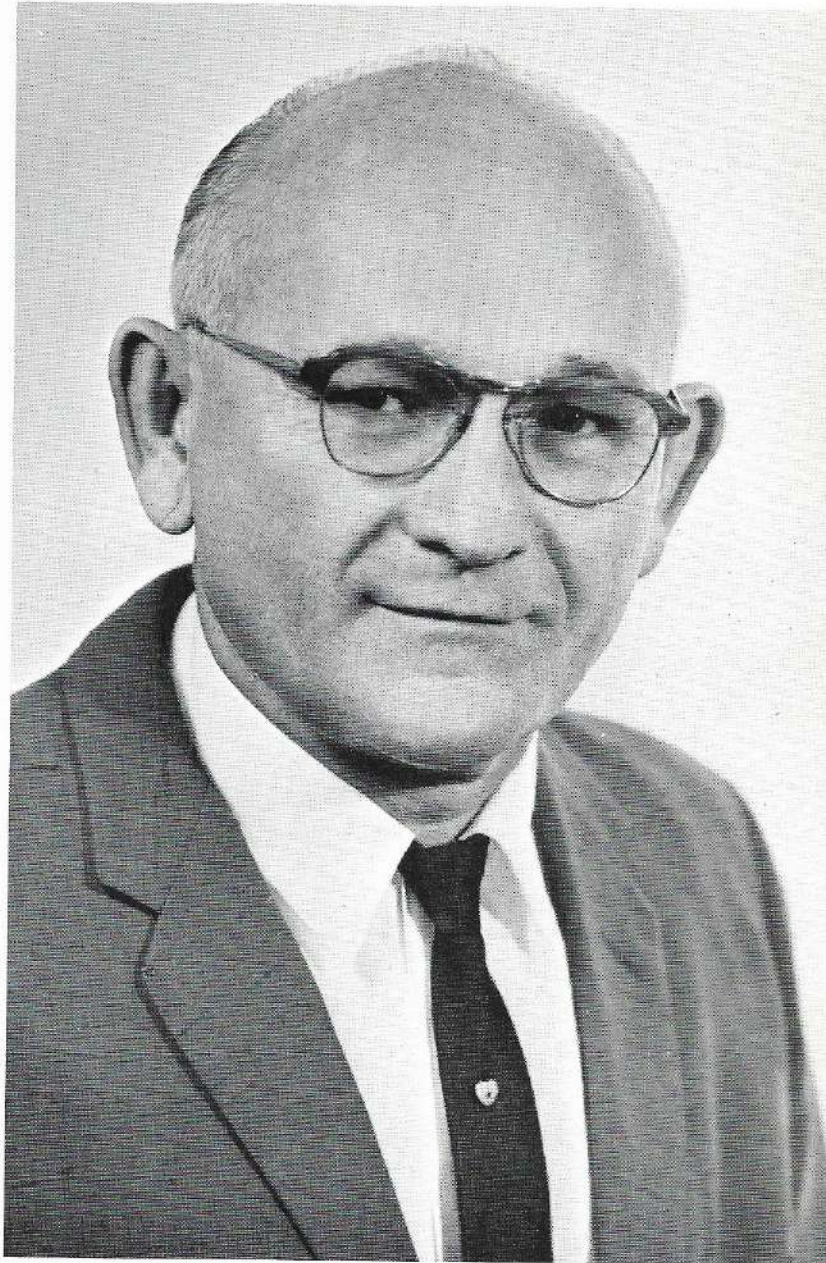
Words seem so trite to express the heartfelt gratitude for him.

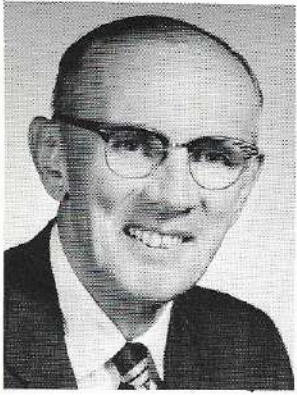

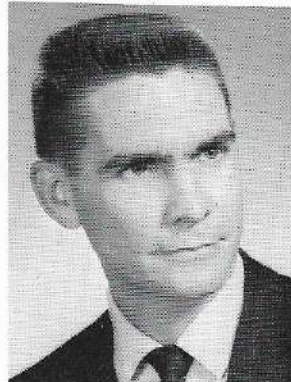

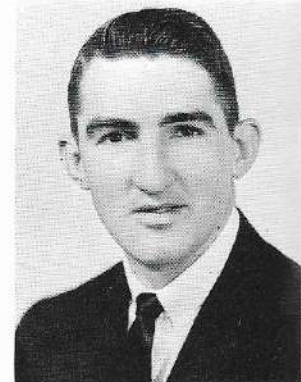

Doctrinal Statement

6. We believe in the resurrection of the crucified body of our Lord, in His ascension into heaven, and His present life there for us, as High Priest and Advocate.

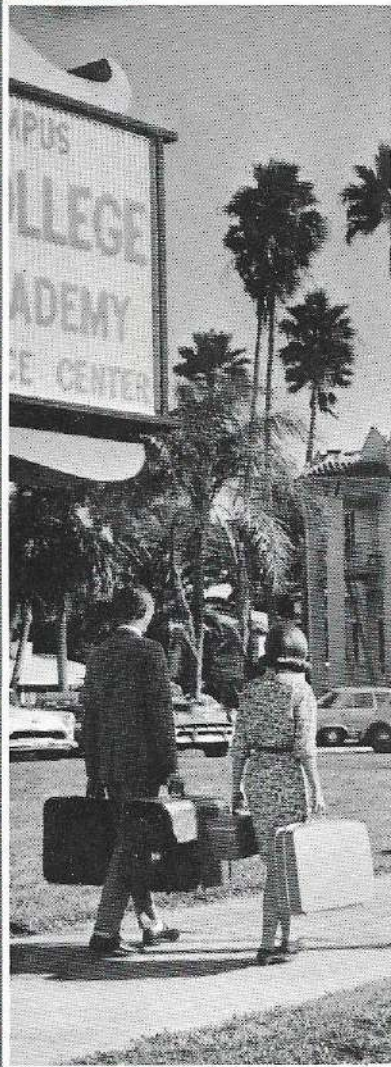
7. We believe in "that blessed hope," the personal, pre-millennial and imminent return of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.
